PRESIDENT'S REPORT

On behalf of the Board and management, it gives me great pleasure to present my third Annual Report. This year has been like no other in the club's 116-year history and despite the many challenges presented by COVID 19 across our entire sporting programs our proud accomplishments since 1905 now stands at a formidable 169 Premierships across all grades, 28 First Grade premierships, 256 Qld representatives including 26 State Team Captains, 5 Qld Championships, 4 Australian Club Champions. We have also had 91 Australian representatives across men's and women's including 13 National Team Captains across the men's and women's XV's and 7's teams.

No one has gone unscathed through this COVID 19 year and I'm proud to say that by pulling together as a family club we have managed to work hard to overcome the associated social and economic challenges that descended on us all. What has been made very clear was the vitally important part that community sporting clubs play in maintaining and strengthening the social fabric of our local communities. With everyone's hard work we were able to finally enjoy and appreciate an abbreviated rugby and touch season, one that I hope we don't ever have to experience again.

We acknowledge and commend:

- § The extraordinary measures taken by both Federal and State Governments that helped cushion the economic blow and helped sporting clubs across the country to survive and continue to offer important social and sporting opportunities for our local communities
- § The QRU, BJRU, Metro Touch, MRP (GingerCloud) and all of the Brisbane Premier Clubs for their tireless efforts to help deliver worthwhile competitions for both senior, junior rugby and touch programs. It was through the hard work of these bodies and their many volunteers that provided wonderful and fulfilling experiences for both players and supports.
- § Our Brothers parents, and supporters who pulled together and displayed empathy, understanding and unbelievable generosity which enabled the club to work our way through the many issues that came with this global pandemic. Without this support our club would not have been able to sustainably navigate our way through the economic challenges and continue to provide our various sporting programs. I'm sure we were all extremely grateful that we were able to adapt to a new 'COVID normal ' while continuing to enjoy an exciting and fulfilling return to grassroots rugby and touch.
- § The work that continues to be performed by our selfless and hardworking players, volunteers and staff, along with the generous support and goodwill of our members, supporters and our local community.
- § The Board for their exceptional efforts throughout the year. I'm proud to say that your elected representatives continue to 'walk the talk" and contribute to building on our governance, financial sustainability and enhanced operational practices. I would especially like to extend a special appreciation to departing Board Members Russell McCart who will continue to act as the Chair of our Redevelopment Subcommittee; Peter Bayo (Co-Chair Sporting Subcommittee) who will continue his involvement in Club Junior Rugby; Tony Lalor who will continue to serve as our Annual Pre- Test Luncheon Coordinator; and last, but not least our amazing Treasurer (since amalgamation) Brenden Yantsch who will continue to be an important member of our Redevelopment Subcommittee. These outstanding volunteers have demonstrated in all their endeavors what is truly great about our historic club..
- § The Club's Strategic Plan and the supporting business plans have had to undergo some fine-tuning this year to remain flexible and continue to support each of the Three Pillars; Sporting, Economic and Community. It is these business plans continue to provide the guiding path for all of the Club's subcommittees and major event committees. It is every chairperson's goal to ensure that we work diligently in these unprecedented times to continue to build on our past achievements and enhance the future sustainability of the club.

- § Our Club Secretary Graeme Linklater for his leadership and continued endeavors to improve our Board governance and operating procedures and for his significant efforts in compiling, with the assistance of Board Member Anthony McDermott, the Club's 2020 Annual Report.
- § The contribution and guidance provided by our Sporting Subcommittee made up of Co-Chairmen Sean Hardman and Peter Bayo (Clubman of the Year), committee members Centurion and Board Member Jennifer Gillett, Chief Executive Officer Matt Kaye, Rugby Manager Ryan Schultz, Touch Coordinator Jodie Clarke, Their dedication and thoroughness when dealing with the many multi-faceted challenges over the past year has been exemplary and has gone a long way to continue to raise the standards across all of our many junior and senior sporting programs.
- § The work of our Life Member Subcommittee chaired by Jamie Windsor who facilitated the nomination and approval of two new Club Life Members John Diamond and Paul French.
- § That we now have 36 Life Members, more than 800 Volunteer Members and 323 Financial Members. It is our intention with your help to increase the number of Supporter Members by introducing a simpler online membership portal for renewal of 2021 memberships.
- § That we were able to achieve another outstanding result getting eight teams through to grades and colts grand finals, winning the 6th Grade (Fire Ants) Grand Final and for the first time in our history claiming the 'Triple Crown' winning Colts 1,2 & 3 Premierships. These Colts results are amazing accomplishments by players, coaches and support staff and the leadership of Colts Coordinator Tony Wall. We should also recognise and celebrate that we are probably the first and only rugby club in Australia, if not the world, to have achieved over the last three consecutive years an amazing 25 teams playing rugby grand finals, winning 12.
- § The behaviour and sportsmanship displayed during the finals series held at Ballymore and at White's Hill Reserve. Both on and off the field our players, support staff and loyal supporters consistently reinforced the values of grassroots rugby and touch our commitment to the 'Brothers Way', regardless of the result.
- § The Elite Development Program (EDP), which has been generously supported over the last seven years by Glenn Rohrig (Rohrig Group). This Elite Development program, which this year has been extended to the Women's program, continues to provide an important pathway for players and plays an integral role in the recruitment, development, retention and success of our young men and women.
- § Peter Bayo and our Junior Rugby Subcommittee of John Irwin, Desiree Cullen and Ian Porter This team of 'doers' were amazing and were able to plan, organize and implement what I'm sure all of our Junior Rugby players would agree was a successful and very enjoyable competition. To see and hear the smiles and laughter return to Crosby and Windsor Parks was fantastic and of course let's not forget the wonderful help and support of their families, coaches and managers.
- § Our Crosby Park Redevelopment Subcommittee members led by retiring Board Member and Chair Russell McCart, Project Development Manager John Shepherd, Peter Bayo and Matt Kaye for their continued efforts over the last four years. Stage 1A works end next February the completion of the Bottom Field surface refurbishment. In particular this year, which has seen the Club achieve a significant project milestone, the lodging of our Development Application (DA) with our landlords Brisbane City Council. We are quietly confident that the DA will be approved prior to this Xmas. This will then lead to commencement of Stage 1B, in the first quarter of 2021 and will deliver the first of the commercial structures and arrangements delivering an annual revenue stream to comfortably meet our liabilities. We are grateful for the continued support of the Brothers Foundation who provided a sizeable donation, which helped cover the costs associated with the DA. With this support the Redevelopment Subcommittee along with the Fundraising Subcommittee have been able to continue to drive what is arguably, the most significant and exciting upgrade to our club facilities in the Club's 71 years at Crosby Park.

- § Vice President Geoff Rodgers who continues to work tirelessly on many fronts, but most significantly as Chair of our Fundraising Subcommittee which has been strongly supported by retiring Treasurer Brenden Yantsch. The fundraising strategy and plan which we have called “Brothers; Building a Stronger Community Campaign”, continues under the patronage of club stalwarts Tony Shaw and Paul McLean. The fundraising campaign will be critical to the progress of our staged redevelopment and we thank those that have already generously contributed, and we look forward to more support from our general membership and supporter base. I would ask you all to consider supporting this worthy campaign in any way you are able.
- § Geoff’s generosity for providing his skilled and experienced Rowland team to perform a comprehensive review and update of our club website in preparation for a more streamlined and modern looking website for 2021.
- § The diligent efforts of our Economic Subcommittee Chaired by Treasurer Brenden Yantsch and includes Des Hogan OAM, CEO Matt Kaye and Club Bookkeeper Nicole Elder. This team has achieved an amazing financial result given the significant economic challenges presented by COVID 19. In Brenden’s final year as Club Treasurer, he is pleased to report a very commendable net operating profit of \$12,000. What was very significant was that the four home game days that we were finally able to hold, while providing welcomed social reunions these home games delivered outstanding and substantial financial outcomes. These important events helped to offset the lost revenue from the forced cancellations of most of our major annual events. Of course, continued diligence and adherence to expenditure budgets and cost management targets by our CEO have also contributed to this commendable result. Next year will continue to present financial challenges across a several cost centres and will require a continued focus on controlling day to day operational expenditures and vigorous pursuit of existing and additional revenue streams.
- § The substantial efforts of our Community Subcommittee, led by Board Member Scott Jensen. The year officially began with the inaugural ‘Community Day’ held at Lancaster Park, Ascot. As a new initiative for the Club, its purpose was to broaden our engagement with the wider community and invite interest and interaction with the various aspects of the Club, as well as showcase the upcoming Crosby Park Redevelopment Plan. Whilst all had a great day, little did we know what was to unfold. COVID 19 inevitably hindered our ability to engage and connect with the community at large. Despite the imposed restraints, the subcommittee got to work on delivering four high quality home games, including our annual Ladies Day and Corporate Day, with the former being held on a huge final round afternoon against eventual Premier Grade Champions, Easts Rugby. Hosting these four home games secured critical revenue for the Club’s operations and ensured some of the financial risk brought about by COVID-19 could be mitigated.
- § On the sponsorship front, the Club formally recognises the loyalty, support and trust shown by our valuable sponsors and business partners who have stood by the Club and shown a great understanding with respect to the limitations imposed on the Club. We are eternally grateful for their ongoing support as we build toward an exciting and prosperous 2021. The Club also took the opportunity through the affected season to review our sponsorship strategy, with the outcome being a more streamlined, program-based approach that will ensure our current and future partners receive greater value and a more direct connection to the rugby and touch programs.. On this point specifically, we look forward to welcoming some new and returning sponsors to the Club. We would like give a massive thank you to Dwight and Tonja Ferguson (Ray White Ascot) and Faran Gouldson, (Gouldson Legal) who have agreed to continue as our Major Sponsors for the next 3 years. Thanks to Rohrig Group, Green Beacon Brewing, Canterbury and Australian Catholic University (ACU). We have over 40 partners and although there are too many to name individually, we sincerely appreciate you sticking with the club and look forward to working with you all again in what we hope is a more stable and predictable 2021.
- § The Community subcommittee has also embarked on a ‘Fraternity’ Project that will see us bring the network of Christian Brothers clubs closer together for the betterment of our rugby programs, community engagement and commercial opportunities. With one eye on 2021, the subcommittee looks forward to reinstating some of our iconic events such as the Crosby Park Long Lunch and Test Match Luncheon as well as a more comprehensive Membership Program for our key audiences. We also recognise the sterling efforts of our longtime organisers of our Corporate Golf Day at Royal Queensland. Mark Stanton, Geoff Rodgers, Paul McLean, Dwight Ferguson & Matt Kaye.

- § Whilst Season One Junior Touch was cancelled due to COVID 19 , we were still able to run a Junior Rep program for the players. Thank you to our Junior Rep Coordinator Carla Clayton, junior coaches and a manager for ensuring the club was able to participate in the Caboolture Junior Carnival. Season Two Junior Touch went off without any problems with the help of a number of hard-working volunteers that were able to ensure that the players and supporters complied with the Club COVID 19 Plan. Our Senior Programs Metro Cup and State Cup are now completed, and I would like to congratulate the way the teams conducted themselves during the season. Thank you to Bernie Morrison (Touch Coaching Director) and our Touch subcommittee members for your amazing support during the season.
- § Our Senior Player Leadership Group led by Club Captain Reuben Wall and Premier Grade Captain Tom Moloney, who have had their own challenges this year trying hard with all the COVID restrictions to promote and nurture club player culture among the senior grades. It is hoped that next season our senior players can once again return to their past active involvement with the junior rugby program and special events,
- § Stephen "Stumpy" Twist, and the Butchery Team for their efforts in introducing improved operational practices and encouraging growth in membership of the 'Butchery'. We also need to again thank our resident 'DJ' George Moloney for helping to create a unique atmosphere and enhancing our spiritual home. Due to COVID restrictions our very popular Kids Corner was not able to operate, but we hope we can have this fun activity return in 2021
- § The help and guidance of our local politicians Federal Member for Brisbane Trevor Evans, State Member for Clayfield Tim Nicholls, and Hamilton Ward Councilor David McLachlan. These elected representatives have been long-time supporters of Brothers and we look forward to their future support as we pursue further government infrastructure grants as an important component of the overall funding model for the redevelopment of Crosby Park.
- § Our Brothers' Family, who provided their sympathies and support to the families and friends of our departed players and members this year. Lest we forget Life Members Jack Buchanan & Pat Oswald, club stalwarts and Old and Australian representatives Shane Nightingale and Dr Michael J Barry and sadly junior player Archie Gouldson who was taken from us far too young.
- § It was heartening to see past Junior player Alex Clarke at the Grand Final Series with his carers. Alex is coping as well as can be expected and we continue to support Alex post his life changing rugby accident in 2018. We look forward to again welcoming Alex and his family at future home games in 2021.

TREASURER'S REPORT

I am pleased to present the audited financial statements and Treasurer's Report of the club for the year ended 31 October 2020. The club has weathered these impacts of COVID-19 and has ended the year in a strong position. There are many people who have contributed to the club's survival in 2020 however there are 3 main groups that have had a significant impact on the club's financial position at year end. Firstly a thank you to the Matt Kaye and staff for their extraordinary efforts during shutdown and to produce a season of value to all members. Secondly to the players, parents and members. Perhaps the club's most significant financial risk during COVID-19 was the risk of membership refunds. It was heartening to see all members provide the club with the opportunity to deliver a belated and shortened season. Thirdly to all levels of government, Local, State and Federal for the relevant stimulus and grants provided. Without these the club would have been in a much different position come year end.

Net profit is reported as \$12,233, down from a profit of \$66,139 in 2019. This is a great result for the club and largely on the back of \$213,681 of stimulus, grants and rebates.

Financial summary - The key financial information in relation to the 2020 financial year are as follows:

- **Net profit after depreciation and abnormal items \$12,233 (2019 profit \$66,139)**
- **Operating profit before depreciation and abnormal items \$138,215 (2019 profit \$31,700)**
- **Total income** € 40% \$1,251,703 [2019 \$2,101,379]
 - Sporting – sporting revenues for XV's junior and senior, 7's have remained consistent with prior years. The delayed start had most impact on touch program with only one season offered.
 - Community – COVID-19 had the greatest impact in this area. The club was unable to have the usual fundraising and club events
 - Economic – all income streams from Economic were down due to the shorter season. This income was bolstered by the receipt of the local, state and Federal stimulus, grants and rebates.
- **Total expenses** € 35% \$1,327,168, [2019 \$2,069,678]
 - Sporting – sporting expenditures were reduced due to cost cutting and the shorter season
 - Community – no expenditures due to cancelled events
 - Economic – the club worked hard to manage costs during the COVID-19 shutdown which saw an overall reduction in most cost centres for the year
 - Administration – remained consistent with prior year
- The focus for the 2020 year was survival. The club has weathered these impacts and has ended the year in a strong position.
- The 2021 year will see the continuation of delivering the quality sporting programs. When DA is obtained for the balance of the Masterplan Stage 2 Aquatic Centre can commence immediately. A major focus will be the approval of the club debt required and the fundraising required to deliver this project.

Conclusion

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Matt Kaye and all BRC staff for their efforts. In particular I would like to thank Nicole Elder and Des Hogan who have worked tirelessly in assisting the club. I would also like to thank the Management Committee, club sponsors, club volunteers, players, coaches, members and supporters for their contributions to the club during 2020.

I am leaving the Management Committee at this AGM. I thank everyone for the opportunity to be involved with this great club. It has been a privilege to be part of the change in the club over the past 7 years. Being part of the merger process, seeing the expansion in sporting programs to involve touch, 7's and female involvement, to a club with 2400 members, and then being part of the masterplan and redevelopment process has been very rewarding.

I looking forward to my continued involvement with the club on the Masterplan and Fundraising sub-committees.

CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER'S REPORT

I thought 2019 was a challenging year, well I was wrong compared to what we have faced in 2020. When four months of planning and preparation goes out the window, a complete shut down, a restart strategy and planning strategy to rolling out a compressed three-month season with restrictions never seen before. I can be extremely proud of the way the club and community have pulled together in these unprecedented times.

While much of our business planning was shelved and it became survival mode, we conclude the financial year with a surplus and in a better financial position thanks largely to the support of the Brothers community and also various levels of government support. and also the support of the Brothers community.

SPORTING

We continue to develop our programs Rugby and Touch Football with increased participation and pathways to elite the forefront. The Senior Rugby program has once again dominated QLD Premier Rugby with eight (8) Grand Final appearances and four (4) Premierships. In addition, we were crowned joint Doughty Shield Champions with Easts. Congratulations to all players and support staff for the way you conducted yourself throughout the year and the results are a testament to the effort you all put in during the year.

I would like to congratulate all Brothers players who gained selection at International, Super Rugby franchises. After all other representative programs were cancelled, we still had a great representation at the elite level. We currently have four Wallabies who took part in the Tri Nations and at one stage of the QLD Reds season had eight players in the match day 23. This continues to prove that the Brothers Rugby program is one of the best in Australia.

The Junior Rugby program has gone from strength to strength despite the pandemic which derailed the season. I can't thank Peter Bayo and the Junior Sub Committee enough for their hours of work to get every Junior player on the field in 2020. We have seen greater interaction with our parent base and are working extremely hard to deliver an improved season in 2021. Our girls 7s program continues to grow and a structured program will see them become a major force in the various BJRU competitions.

We will continue to further develop our programs in 2021 to ensure we meet the needs of the rugby fraternity. We have setup various sub committees to engage more support and ensure greater engagement from our members. Thanks to Board Members Sean Hardman, Peter Bayo and Rugby Manager Ryan Schultz for their dedication to the Rugby program throughout the year.

Brothers Touch Association has become a major part of our club. Unfortunately Season One Junior Touch was cancelled due to COVID however numbers were strong in our Season Two for Junior Girls & Boys. We were able to run a Junior Rep program despite the cancellation of the Junior State Cup. Our Senior Program includes the Metro Cup & Senior State Cup, for the first time in our short history we ended with two teams playing in a Metro Cup Grand Final, winning the Women's Division 3 Premiership and going down in the Women's Division 1 Grand Final. I would like to thank Jodie Clarke and the Touch Sub Committee for their commitment and energy throughout this difficult year.

CLUB FACILITIES & OPERATIONS

I would like to thank our valued Club Sponsors who stuck by the club during these uncertain times. Without their financial support, the club wouldn't have been able to get through the year. We have undertaken a review of our sponsorship strategy and are implementing a fresh approach to 2021. I am extremely encouraged and excited long term Major Sponsors Dwight Ferguson, Tonja Ferguson and Faran Gouldson have extended their support for the club for a further three years. This is a testament to the club's brand and values, and we are grateful for their generous support.

We have been fortunate enough to receive a number of government grants including Job Keeper, Cash flow boost and a Gambling Fund Community Benefit Grant. This has all assisted in presenting a stable financial position at the end of the year. Unfortunately, the club's functions and event revenue were the hardest hit due to limited number of opportunities and the QLD health restrictions. We anticipate that we will be able to run our normal schedule of events in 2021 including that of the annual Test Luncheon.

I would like to acknowledge our club staff who have all worked above and beyond their duties this year. All staff were stood down for a period during the year and we are still in a position of reduced hours for a couple of staff members. I think the Brothers community owe a lot to this amazing staff, Ryan Schultz, Jason Neylon, Karen Nichols, Alan Anderson, Manuel Cole Manolis, Nicole Elder and Jodie Clarke. Also, our volunteers across the club, thank you for your continued support of the club. Special thank you to Age Group Coordinators, Hobbits, Coaches, Team Managers, Crosby Park set up crew and parents.

COMMUNITY

The Crosby Park Master Plan continues to be one of the most important milestones in the club history. It has been exciting to help shape the club's future and provide a Community Sporting Hub that we can all be extremely proud of. Stage 1A will be near complete prior to the 2021 Rugby Season. We hope that our development application which was submitted this year will allow the club to begin construction sometime in the near future.

Finally, to the Brothers Rugby Club Board led by David Hine thank you for providing the direction and guidance throughout the year. You should be proud of your achievements in creating what is Australia's largest community rugby club.

The 2020 senior rugby season would turn out to be the longest rugby season ever facilitated that would see the club experience two preseasons, a global pandemic and a shortened intense competition. It certainly was not the normal rugby season, but to the credit of the club, staff, volunteers and players everyone adapted to ensure the on going performance our of program.

Grades Rugby

Building of the success of the last couple of seasons the grades program again had another very successful year. With 2020 seeing the change of colts going to Under 20 there was no graduation of players from colts to grades but we were still able to manage seven senior rugby teams. We fielded six very strong grades teams throughout the year and it also included the return of the renowned FireAnts into the 6th Grade competition.

The Premier Grade program saw the introduction of Anthony Mathison as Head Coach after Rod Seib securing an opportunity with the Reds Academy after our successful 2019 season. The premier grade program would be severely hindered by Covid as we would at times have up to 12 players restricted to the Reds Covid Bubble. The squad were still a very competitive force throughout the year and their season would come down to the final round with five team all vying for the final four spots. Unfortunately results did not go our way losing to the eventual Premiers Easts by two points in the final round.

The depth and quality of the rugby program was on show in the remainder of all grades teams. All teams were dominant throughout the shortened season and 2nd Grade – 6th Grade teams would all make the Grand Finals. Our alignment of programs throughout the grades team ensured consistent performance, pathways for players and allow coaches to provide consistent methodology on the training paddock. Unfortunately the grades success at Grand Final time would not go to plan with only the mighty 6th Grade FireAnts securing our only premiership. Every team had their chances on the day, but there was some pivotal lessons learnt that will ensure growth in 2021.

Colts Rugby

Colts transitioned into a Under 20 competition in 2020 which resulted Brothers fielding five colts teams (136 registered players) within the four competitions. The colts 4 competition would change to a Thursday Night format and turned out to be a great success. It would allow these teams to play in front of their home crowd every fortnight and provided a great opportunity for the senior club to get together.

The colts program is the backbone of our rugby club and to ensure the ongoing success of it we introduced a Director of Colts role (Tony Wall) in 2020. Tony was instrumental in ensuring the alignment of programs, consistency of selections and that our colts players developed each week. The staff within the colts program would also play a huge role in ensuring weekly performance and ensuring the colts players felt at home at the club. This outstanding commitment would result in all colts teams securing final positions and us achieving the Triple Crown.

Womens Rugby

2020 was a re-building year for the Brothers Women's Program and saw the introduction of a new coaching and support staff. With the focus on developing our program to be the best in the competition, it was also very exciting to introduce designated strength and conditioning and medical support, the Women's Elite Development Program and a partnership with ACU.

With the new coaching set up and support structures there was great growth in the program with 34 players registered throughout the season. The team performed valiantly each week and by the last round were very competitive against an Easts side who would go on to win the premiership. There are exciting times ahead for Women's Rugby at Brothers and 2021 should be a big year for the players and team.

- High representation of QLD Reds (8 in match day squad during Super Rugby)
- Doughty Shield (tied with Easts)
- 2nd Grade, 3rd Grade, 4th Grade, Colts 2 and Colts 3 Minor Premierships
- 8 Grand Finals
- 4 Premierships (6th Grade, Colts 1, Colts 2, Colts 3)
- Colts Triple Crown (first time in history)

There were certainly a lot of lessons learnt throughout the 2020 season and it was evident the constraints of Covid severely affected our ability to implement the comprehensive program that a normal season allows. Even with these constraints, the success of the season highlights the importance of staying true to our program philosophy, ensuring our culture is strong and providing an environment where our players can be their best.

A huge thank you to everyone who was a part of the senior rugby program in 2020 especially our volunteer coaches and managers, the team at Junction Road Physio, Brothers staff and our unreal playing membership.

This has been a year like no other for community sport. We had huge plans for 2020 after such a positive 2019.

Brothers had a huge representation at the National Touch League and junior players at the Broncos youth development camp.

We decided to suspend play once the government made the announcement on March 13th to keep our members and community safe. We worked tirelessly through COVID shut down to ensure that we had a club to return to and a touch program for our players to come back to.

July saw the restart of community sport through the different stages. From small training groups of non-contact to game play. Our numbers were limited and our time frames shortened. We did our best to bring a viable touch football program to our community. Combine the new COVID restrictions with a new national registration system and this season has truly being the most difficult of my career.

We were fortunate to be able to run season 2 for our junior boys and girls. A metro program and a junior and senior representative program. We engaged with ACU off the back of the rugby relationship with ACU and ran a short 6 week social mixed comp we hope to build on this in the future.

We had Brothers junior players and coaches and managers attend National Youth Championships in October for the Cobras Brisbane Regional team.

Brothers entered 5 metro teams. Our most successful metro season with two teams - Div 1 women and Div 3 women marking the grand final and our Div 3 women being crowned champions in an exciting drop off.

Thank you to our technical coaching director, Bernie Morrison for overseeing our metro program and developing and mentoring our coaches and players.

With the junior state cup being cancelled for 2020, we were still able to deliver a representative program for our representative players. 5 BTA rep teams participated in training programs and clinics and competed at the sunshine community Cup.

QLD Senior State cup is able to go ahead. BTA will be sending 4 senior cup teams.



We are currently in planning for 2021. All of our ideas and plans from 2020 we hope to finally activate in 2021. A senior competition for the first half of the year is our priority, EDP for our touch and to engage our Elite female players into the 7s and 15s rugby program.

2021 we hope will be a positive year for our touch affiliate. We are looking to restructure and redevelop our pathways

Our administrator, has just been appointed to The RAP panel for Touch Football Australia. The Reconciliation Action Plan panel is looking at participation and engagement of our First Nations people. This is a huge appointment.

Thank you to all of our volunteers this year, we would not have survived without our volunteer group. To all coaches and managers, thank you for bringing our amazing game to our kids and every week.

We look forward to seeing all of our community in 2021.

MODIFIED RUGBY PROGRAM (MRP)



As was experienced by our whole community, 2020 was a difficult year for the Modified Rugby Program (MRP) at Brothers given the impacts of COVID-19. Due to restricted field space, we were only able access one session of training per week, everybody missed playing a game but were grateful to get back on the field. Whilst adapted, the MRP season was enjoyed by all our five teams of MRP, MRP 7s, MRP 7s plus and MRP Colts teams.

The MRP is a world first, modified form of touch only rugby where each girl, boy or young adults with Autism, Aspergers or a learning and perceptual disability (MRP Players) has their own club PlayerMentor on the field supporting them. The MRP aims to move our MRP Players off the sidelines and into the main game. Through the GingerCloud Leadership Program, PlayerMentors are nurtured and supported as they develop into a generation of young people for whom disability is normalised.

The MRP was created by GingerCloud Foundation (whose co-founders are a family from Brothers Megan and Anthony Elliott) with the support of the Queensland Rugby Union (QRU) and Rugby Australia (RA) and was piloted at Brothers in 2014 with 16 participants.

A highlight of the 2020 Adapted MRP season at Brothers was a visit by MRP Ambassadors Nathan Sharpe and Tim Horan AM.

In 2021, 17 Clubs from North Qld to the ACT will host MRP teams with close to 420 participants.

Jack graduated with a degree in civil engineering from the University of Queensland in 1947, and after previously playing for the Red Heavies, began his Rugby career with Brothers in 1949 and played 94 first grade games between 1949 to 1953 and 1957.

Playing under renowned coach Joe French, Jack was a consistent performer for the club during the early 1950's and was an integral part of the club's premiership winning sides in 1949, 50, 1951 and 1953, unfortunately missing out on 5 in a row because of the Challenge Final loss to University in 1952.

Jack started the season as coach of the 1953 side until he made a decisive call. "I didn't think I was getting the best out of the team. I approached Joe because we needed him to come back and smarten us up," Buchanan recalled. Buchanan was needed again as a player in any case because of injuries. French slipped comfortably back in as coach to steer Brothers to the title, his fifth and final premiership and Jack who shared in his fourth.

By 1957, the "clear evidence of a resurgence of club spirit", noted in the annual report, was positive, and stalwarts John Buchanan, Jock McKendry and Alan Dunn also showed the right club spirit by un-retiring themselves to help out A Grade so disruptions to other grades were minimised.

Jack also made an immense contribution to the club off the field. As one of the Club's Donors from 1956 to 1958, he was one amongst others was responsible for helping to cover the fundraising costs of the Club, during the tough first decade managing and maintaining the Crosby Park lease. .

Brothers originally acquired Albion's Crosby Park in 1949 and by 1951 the improvements to Crosby Park had begun. The building of the famous Green Shed lead by Joe French, Peter and Tom Sweeney, Frank Kenny, Peter O'Shea amongst others and Jack Buchanan, a civil engineer, used his instruments so a field could be properly pegged out. marking the boundaries on which Jack Ross Oval sits to this day.

Upon finishing his Rugby career, Jack worked with Pioneer Concrete across Australia and abroad, before eventually settling in Sydney.

Jack's requiem funeral mass was held on Friday 18th September 2020 at 10.00am at, Holy Family Catholic Church at Lindfield. After the requiem mass, the funeral cortege made its way to the place in Macquarie Park Cemetery known as the "Stations of the Cross" for the burial.

BROTHERS WOMEN'S PROGRAM

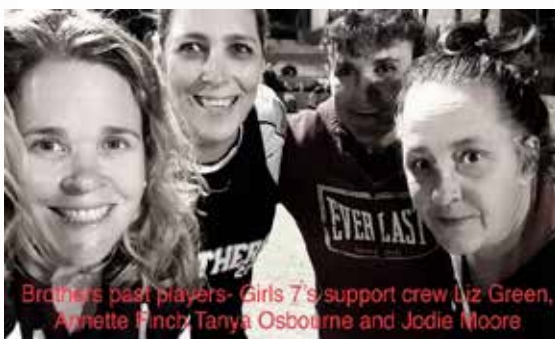

Qualified Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report, of Brothers Rugby Club Inc (the Association), which comprises the Balance Sheet as at 31 October 2020, the Income Statement for the year then ended, the statement of cash flows and notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and the statement by members of the committee.

In our opinion, except for the possible effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph, the financial report represents fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Association as at 31 October 2020 and its financial performance for the year then ended in accordance with the accounting policies described in note 1 to the financial statements and the requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (Qld)* (as amended by the *Associations Incorporation and Other Legislation Amendment Act (Qld) 2007*).

Basis for Qualified Opinion

Cash Receipts

It was not practicable for the Association to establish effective internal control over the receipt of cash transactions such as subscriptions, registrations, and other fundraising activities. Accordingly, it is not possible for our examination to include audit procedures to extend beyond the amounts of transactions recorded in the accounting records of Brothers for the year ended 31 October 2020. In our opinion, monies recorded from cash receipts have been properly accounted for.

We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report section of our report. We are independent of the Association in accordance with the auditor independence requirements of the ethical requirements of the Accounting Professional and Ethical Standards Board's APES 110 Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (the Code) that are relevant to our audit of the financial report in Australia. We draw attention to Note 1 to the financial statement, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared to assist the Association to comply with the financial reporting provisions of the *Associations Incorporation Act 1981 (Qld)* (as amended by the *Associations Incorporation and Other Legislation Amendment Act (Qld) 2007*). As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose.

Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance

The financial statements cover Brothers Rugby Club Inc. as an individual entity. Brothers Rugby Club Inc. is a not-for-profit association incorporated in Queensland under the Associations Incorporation Act 1981 ('the Act').

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

1 Basis of preparation

In the opinion of the Management Committee, the association is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist users of the financial statements who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. These special purpose financial statements have been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the Act.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards and Accounting Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements, AASB 107 Statement of Cash Flows, AASB 108 Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors and AASB 1054 Australian Additional Disclosures.

Significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and are consistent with prior reporting periods unless otherwise stated.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

2 Summary of significant accounting policies

Income Tax

Under current legislation, the Association is exempt from income tax under section 50-45 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

In accordance with the Club Constitution and operations the Management Committee consider that the main purpose during the year is the encouragement of the game of Rugby, and as such income derived from all sources is exempt from income tax.

Revenue and other income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the Association and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

Registrations and Membership

Revenue from registrations and membership, and touch rugby are recognised when received.

Grants

Non-reciprocal grant revenue is recognised in profit or loss when the entity obtains control of the grant and it is probable that the economic benefits gained from the grant will flow to the entity and the amount of the grant can be measured reliably.

Donations

Donations, pledges and bequests are recognised on an accrual basis and is recognised when the pledge is made. At that point it is considered that the economic benefit associated with the transaction will flow to the Association.

Interest

Interest revenue is recognised as it accrues using the effective interest method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

Trust Distribution - Southside Unit Trust

Trust income is recognised when the present entitlement to the distribution has been established.

Sale of goods

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised at the point of delivery as this corresponds to the transfer of significant risks and rewards of ownership of the goods and the cessation of all involvement in those goods.

Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of GST.

Capital expenditure

Capital expenditure relates to the work undertaken prior to any development application (DA) being approved. This includes maintenance, upgrade of lights, field maintenance, other maintenance and professional fees associated with any DA process.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents comprises cash on hand, demand deposits and short-term investments which are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value.

Property, plant and equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment.

Property, plant and equipment is depreciated on a straight-line basis over the asset's useful life to the Association, commencing when the asset is ready for use.

The assets residual values and useful lives are reviewed and adjusted if appropriate, at each balance sheet date.

An asset's carrying amount is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the asset's carrying amount is greater than its recoverable amount.

Employee benefits

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits that are expected to be wholly settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled.

Employee benefits relating to long service leave balances are the expected amounts to be paid and is accrued when an employee reaches 7 years of employment. Changes in measurement of the liability are recognised in the Income Statement.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost of inventory is determined using the first-in-first-out basis and is net of any rebates and discounts received. Net realisable value is estimated using the most reliable evidence available at the reporting date and inventory is written down through an obsolescence provision if necessary.

Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgements

The Management Committee evaluate estimates and judgements incorporated into the financial statements based on historical knowledge and best available current information. Estimates assume a reasonable expectation of future events and are based on current trends and economic data, obtained both externally and within the Association.

Key estimates

Inventories

- i. As a consequence of the amalgamation of the clubs and change in logos all inventories carrying the old club logos have been written off and represented in the Impairment to Inventories. It is anticipated that these items will need to be sold at discounted rates or given away as part of club promotions.

Investments

- i. The club owns an asset being a perpetual membership at Ballymore. The historical cost of this asset is \$10,000. The lack of a ready market for this asset and the diminishing economic benefits following the reduction in games being played at Ballymore an impairment loss of \$9,999 has been raised to record the carrying value at \$1. This determination will be reviewed annually, and adjustments made in future periods if future market activity or estimate of future economic benefit indicates that such adjustments are appropriate.

Property Plant & Equipment - useful life

Buildings and leasehold improvements

- i. Crosby Park - during 2017 the Association signed a 10 year lease with Brisbane city council. There is no expectation that the lease would not be renewed at the expiration of the lease term. As such the Management Committee consider a 50 year useful life appropriate for buildings and leasehold improvements.
- ii. Windsor Park - in 2014 the previous junior Association signed a licence agreement with St Margaret's Anglican Girls School for access to the shared grounds and facilities at Windsor Park for all U6 to U9 games and training, U10 to U12 training and Association Events. The term of the agreement is 15 years and annual licence fees are payable on a monthly basis. There is no expectation that the lease would not be renewed at the expiration of the lease term.

Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

Adoption of New and Revised Accounting Standards

The association has adopted AASB 16 Leases as at 1 November 2019. As permitted by AASB, comparatives for the 2019 reporting period have not been restated and any difference between asset and liability recognised in the opening balances has been applied to retained earnings at transition.

Applying AASB 16, for leases (being the licence to occupy Crosby Park and Windsor Park), the Association:

- Recognises right-of-use assets and lease liabilities in the statement of financial position, initially measured at the present value of the future lease payments
- Recognises depreciation of right-of-use assets and interest on lease liabilities in profit or loss
- Separates the total amount of cash paid into a principal portion (presented within financing activities) and interest (presented within financing activities) in the statement of cash flows.

Lease incentives (e.g. rent-free period) are recognised as part of the measurement of the right-of-use assets and lease liabilities whereas under AASB 117 they resulted in the recognition of a lease incentive amortised as a reduction of rental expenses generally on a straight-line basis. Under AASB 16, right-of-use assets are tested for impairment in accordance with AASB 136 Impairment of Assets.

COVID-19

Judgement has been exercised in considering the impacts that the Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic has had, or may have, on the association based on known information. The outbreak and the response of Governments in dealing with the pandemic has had the following impact on the association:

- Deferral to the start of the rugby playing season
- Shortening of the rugby season
- Cancellation of the Autumn touch season
- Cancellation of club events and fundraising activities
- Reduction in sponsorship revenue and greater write off of bad debts
- Reduction of investment income from Southside Unit Trust
- Cancellation of rugby tours
- Reduction in rent revenue and function room hire
- Receipt of ATO stimulus Cashflow Boost and Jobkeeper
- Receipt of QRIDA Job Support Loan
- Receipt of BCC rebates

It is not possible to estimate the impact of the outbreak's near-term and longer-term effects or Governments' varying efforts to combat the outbreak and support businesses. This being the case, we do not consider it practicable to provide a quantitative or qualitative estimate of the potential impact of this outbreak on the association at this time.

Except for the above, no other matters or circumstances have arisen since the end of the financial year which significantly affected or could significantly affect the operations of the association, the results of those operations or the state of affairs of the association in future financial years.

19 Capital Commitments – Masterplan		
The Club may incur significant capital expenditure in the future due to the proposed Master Plan for Crosby Park. Stage 1A to the Master Plan has commenced and is fully funded. The balance of the Master Plan has been submitted for development approval with the Brisbane City Council. If the Master Plan proceeds the club's anticipated contribution toward the entire redevelopment is approximately \$8.5 million dollars. These funds will come from various sources being cash and donations, debt funding and corporate partnerships. The remaining funding for the Masterplan will come from grant funding and tenant contributions.		
All known current commitments are provided for in the financial statements as "Current Payables – Masterplan capital expenditure", and all future commitments known at 31 October 2020 are provided for as "Accruals – Masterplan capital expenditure".


