PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Thanks to the coaching and management staff volunteers and my fellow Board members for all the work put in this year.

Congratulations also to the players on the way you have conducted yourselves on and off the paddock.

2007 Season

Paul Mills' comprehensive report outlines in detail the Club's success on the paddock in 2007, as well as our representation honours.

Could I add my thanks and congratulations to all those who played, coached, assisted or managed teams in 2007 and to those who played representatively or reached significant Club milestones in 2007. It was a successful year with five teams contesting finals, winning 4th Grade and Colts 2, and going down narrowly to Wests in the Division 1 First Grade Grand Final, in scenes reminiscent of the Premier Grade Grand Final loss in 2006.

It was a rather disjointed season with the introduction of the Australian Rugby Championship (ARC) which necessitated Premier Grade starting the season much earlier than all other grades and finishing well before the rest of the grades.

The ARC has provided several of the Brothers players and coaches (Paul Healy and Tim Grady) through the Ballymore Tornadoes and the Melbourne Rebels an opportunity to play at a higher level and to improve their skills.

Greater discussion and consideration needs to be given to how we integrate the ARC, its timing and impact on the local competition. This is already on the agenda at the QRU for discussion and agreement in conjunction with the Club Presidents.

I would like to particularly mention the Ladies Team and acknowledge their contribution to the Club in terms of Club spirit, supporting Club functions and volunteering and assisting whenever they could. Theirs is an example for the rest of the Club to follow.

Paul Mills

Paul Mills' contract as Rugby Manager expired at the end of this year and has not been renewed.

Paul has given exceptional service to Brothers over a long number of years including the last six as Rugby Manager and Premier Grade Coach. As a player, Paul played 168 Premier Grade games (the fourth highest on record), winning five Premierships and representing Queensland from 1985 to 1988.

Through Paul's stewardship of the Club as Rugby Manager and Premier Grade Coach, he has overseen a tremendous period of renewal. There has been a transformation at the Club in terms of the Club playing an expansive style bringing significant enjoyment to players and supporters alike, along with a significant increase in participation in finals football.

The Club is very appreciative of Paul's loyalty, commitment and hard work over the last five years in the job and wishes him well for the future.

Brothers Rugby Club Foundation

A significant development this year has been the establishment of the Brothers Rugby Club Foundation. The Foundation is registered as a tax exempt organisation through the Australian Sports Federation, which allows the Club to reuse funds for specific projects providing tax benefits to those contributing.

The Foundation operates external to any funds utilised by the Club in the day to day running of the Club.

It will protect funds contributed and ensure that they are directed towards specifically declared development projects which will support the future of the club.

Thanks to those involved in putting it together – Dick McGruther, Dennis Croft and Paul Tully. John Eales has accepted the role as Patron with Paul Dick and Dennis sitting on the Board along with the Presidents of the senior and junior clubs.

2008 will see further development and marketing of the Foundation.

Thanks to my fellow Board members for your commitment and contribution through the year. Whilst we have adequately addressed the day to day issues through the year, there remains a large number of major issues that confront the Club, which require significant focus and attention in 2008.

We need to secure a hard working, committed Board for 2008 as well as more effectively utilising resources connected to the Club on specific projects.

Whilst there have been a number of volunteers who have regularly assisted whose work we value, there are a number who I would like to particularly thank:

- Des Hogan – Des's commitment to the Club is enormous in terms of time and value
- Anthony McDermott – Ant quietly and effectively takes on tasks and has appropriately been awarded Club Man of the Year

- David Cameron – many thanks for the significant work that has been done to secure the licence at the Club. David's passionate, hands on approach has driven this outcome. David and his wife Allanah have provided the impetus for many after match functions as well as providing the food at these functions
- Dennis Croft – for your work in setting up the Brothers Foundation as well as being the Brothers representative on the Tornadoes Board in 2007
- Dick McGruther for your assistance with the renewal of the lease and for the Brothers Foundation
- David Dunworth – for your continued efforts in attempting to finally have printed the book on the Brothers Centenary
- Melissa Price – for your enthusiasm, organisational skills and commitment to whatever project you commit to e.g. Ladies Day at Crosby 2007
- Also thanks to Mark Andrews at the Club, and your staff for the friendliness and cooperation extended to all players and supporters through the year.

There are also those dedicated volunteers who regularly assist such as Pat Oswald, Peter Anderson, Peter Hoare, Ross McKellar, etc.

Issues and challenges for the future

Whilst 2007 was a reasonably successful year on and off the paddock, there are a number of issues and challenges that need serious attention. 2008 will be a very important year for the Club as we:

- Attempt in conjunction with Brothers Juniors to extend our lease to provide guaranteed tenure for Brothers Rugby at Crosby Park
- As part of or following that process, engage with Council to allow us better 'commercial' utilisation of the existing Club facilities as we have a large asset which is aging and is not providing adequate return
- We need to secure our financial security through sponsorship, strict financial management and greater commercial utilisation of our facilities to assist in offsetting the reduction in ARU / QRU grants by 25% in 2008 and 25% in 2009 and the loss of our major sponsor
- Developing sustainable sponsorship deals for the Club as we come to the expiry of the three year deal with Qld Group
- Generating a network of volunteers to assist the Club, through the encouragement of the Brothers fraternity / support base to become more involved
- Strategic access to the utilisation of the Club's members for major projects / issues
- Ensuring that players meet their financial commitment to the Club through the payment of player subscriptions.
- Developing a culture with the players of helping out / volunteering and supporting Club events
- Actively engaging our players and supporters through better communication through the website / regular editions of Ezine / more frequent club events / and updating our database
- Continuing to develop close ties and relationships with Brothers Juniors and their Committee
- Promotion and marketing of the Brothers Foundation.

- With our new liquor licence, ensuring we optimise opportunities for Club functions or events, as well as external opportunities

We appreciate the financial and support provided by the Qld Group and our other sponsors.

We look forward to working with you in 2008 in ensuring greater participation and involvement from players, management and supporters.

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

Season 2007 started in a disjointed fashion with the Premier grade commencing their season on the 3rd of March while the season proper for the remainder of the club started 5 weeks later, this caused major drains on our already limited volunteer base in particular and effectively giving the Club 4 extra home games to cater for.

In season 2007 we once again fielded 10 teams in the Brisbane competitions with our energetic women's team leading the way in participation and club spirit. There was never a home game or club event go by without the full support of all the girls and I would like to congratulate the whole squad and manager Gayle Deighton for their continued support and organization of the girls team.

The Club had another successful season with 5 teams contesting the finals series in various divisions. The Normanby Cup team was desperately unlucky in their preliminary final while Colts 1 were equally unlucky to go down in their knockout final to eventual Premiers Sunnybank. This left Colts 2, Div 1 4th grade and Div 1 1st grade left to contest Grand Finals. The first team to contest their Grand Final was colts 2 who were methodical in their disposal of Easts to take out the Premiership 32 – 8, following colts 2 were the mighty Div 1 4th grade who won a nail biter against University 20 – 13 and then Div 1 1st grade had victory snatched from them on full time by West's 17 – 13, a disappointing end to our visit to Ballymore on Grand Final day.

The Premier team suffered a series of injuries in key positions as we took on the top 3 teams in a row nearing the end of the second round games, on all 3 occasions allowing a commanding half time lead to slip from our grasp and eventually go down each time thus leaving us to languish in 5th position on the table for 2007. A disappointing year as far as our position on the table goes but no one could question the commitment or the exciting style of play the boys displayed throughout the season. We hope the majority will stay on and try and ignite some of the efforts of the previous season which saw our flagship team contest our first Grand Final in 16 years.

The Div 1 4th grade team deserves special mention for their efforts in winning their Grand Final and not just for the fantastic performance on the day but more over their efforts in taking the responsibility to coach and manage themselves throughout the season. The boys could only train one night a week and this made it extremely difficult to find volunteers to help so the lads accepted the challenge and came away with a Premiership flag. Congratulations to all those involved.

Our representative players consisted of Super 14 players Sam Cordingley, Sean Hardman and David Croft. Both Sam and Sean achieved Australia A honours and Test selection and are currently part of the Wallaby squad at the Rugby World Cup in France. Former Brothers player, club coach and current Wallaby coach John Connolly is to be congratulated on his achievements thus far with the Wallabies and we all hope his success continues at the RWC. Others to represent were Anthony Sauer who was named Captain of the Aussie 7's team, Dallan Murphy, Andrew Shaw and Andrew Christie named in the QAS Under 19 squad for the Trans Tasman series. The club's leading try scorer (40 tries) Ili Batibasaga was once again named in the Queensland women's team and also the Wallaroo's (Australian Women's Team) to take on the Kiwi's later in the year, fantastic effort. With the birth of the new National competition (ARC) Brothers were represented by David Croft (Captain) and Damon Murphy who fronted up for the Melbourne Rebels while Sean Hardman, Sam Cordingley (prior to RWC duties), Anthony Sauer, Brendan McKibbin and Paul Doneley pull on the Ballymore Tornadoes jersey for the inaugural Australian Rugby Competition. Congratulations goes to all those who represented from the club in 2007.

The club welcomed 2 further Premier players to the "100 club" during the season with the milestone achieved by Dan Woolnough and Sean Hardman who have been tremendous support to the coaching staff for many years and we congratulate them on this achievement both very deserving recipients of 100 Premier grade games for Brothers Rugby Club.

With the rebirth of the Club tours over the last 5 years Brothers are embarking on a tour to the Cobra 10's tournament in Kuala Lumpur in October 2007 where there is a substantial reward for the winners so we wish our star studded squad all the best in their attempts to win the tournament. This follows tours to Fiji, Argentina (2003 & 2005), Cairns, Rockhampton and Townsville. Many thanks go to Michael Stephenson, Ron Price and Anthony McDermott for their commitment to driving the fundraisers, sponsors & raffles etc, to ensure Brothers can offer our players the opportunity to live the experience of a Club tour and develop Brothers club spirit.

I would like to thank the Junior Committee and Club for their tireless work and active participation with the joint grounds committee. Their efforts to secure a government grant to up grade the dressing sheds, showers & toilets, surrounding pavement areas and the canteen revamp is testament to their participation and can do attitude. They have also taken steps to hopefully acquire Brisbane City Council grant funding to level the Jack Ross Oval in October this along with the Qld Government Water Wise grant that I secured to up grade our irrigation systems for both ovals should see Crosby Park's playing surfaces looking at their best for the commencement of the 2008 season.

IRB SEVENS WORLD SERIES – Adelaide

Australia last won an IRB Sevens World Series event four years ago, on home soil at Lang Park in Brisbane.

Without a home tournament since that time, success has dried up as largely amateur players have had to mix it with the fully contracted pros of the likes of New Zealand, England, South Africa and Fiji on the World Circuit.

Australia was drawn in Pool C of the draw along with Seven's superpower New Zealand, Wales and Hong Kong rounding out the group. Finishing runners-up in the Pool meant Australia would meet Samoa in the Cup Quarter Final; however they were narrowly defeated by 22 points to 17.

Australia would now play England in the Semi Final of the Plate and win the match by 26 points to 21.

The magnificent Adelaide Oval crowd was treated to a home success when Australia won a rare victory against the Springboks of South Africa in the Plate Final.

Anthony Sauer scored a hat trick and Ben Lucas and skipper Tim Atkinson each scored as the home side ran out 31 points to nil winners to take the plate trophy and eight points towards the IRB Sevens World Series race.



MELISSA PRICE:

Earlier in the year, I was lucky enough to be selected as a Team Liaison Officer for the Adelaide 7's. Although I have always been around rugby, I wasn't quite sure what being a Team Liaison Officer would entail.

We converged on sleepy Adelaide a week before Easter and spent that time training and blowing out some of the cobwebs after their long flights in from the Hong Kong 7's leg.

I was asked to work with the Japanese 7's Team. This was exciting and yet so daunting as I didn't speak a word of Japanese.

To my surprise and good fortune, the Coach had lived in Australia and a number of the Team Officials spoke enough English to get by. I then learnt that there was a Tongan player on the Team, which also made things a lot easier.

It was a fantastic week and a really exciting opportunity to work within a dynamic international event in its inaugural year in Adelaide, Australia.

The event itself was a great success considering Adelaide does not have a huge rugby fan base and it was the Easter weekend.

To be apart of that buzz as the teams are given their 60 sec countdown in the holding room prior to run on, to coincide with the live TV broadcast, to working with the IRB and 2 teams on how best to manage a clash of home and away stripes, it was an opportunity I reveled in.

So much so, I have already applied to be a Team Liaison Officer again in 2008.

AUSTRALIAN RUGBY CHAMPIONSHIP

The prime objectives of the Mazda Australian Rugby Championship were to improve the Wallabies, the four Australian Super 14 teams and, importantly, to provide more opportunities for club Rugby players, coaches, referees and administrators to take the next step up the representative ladder.

The Mazda ARC involved three teams from NSW, two from Queensland and one team each from ACT, Victoria and Western Australia, and ran from 10 August to 13 October 2007. Each Mazda ARC team will have 28 players, a total of 224 players across the eight teams.



The top four teams will play in two semi finals to decide the finalists, with each team to play eight rounds of competition. The tournament was played under Rugby's new Experimental Law Variations, which are designed to make the game even more open and entertaining.

Queensland's two teams were aligned with existing clubs and regions, with Sunshine Coast Rugby, Norths-QUT, Brothers, Wests, GPS and University supporting the Wilson HTM Ballymore Tornadoes and Easts, Souths, Sunnybank, Rugby Gold Coast and the Country Heelers the MFS East Coast Aces.

Australia:

Australian Rugby's showpiece awards night provided the perfect backdrop for the unveiling of the Wallabies Squad for the 2007 Rugby World Cup. ARU Managing Director & CEO John O'Neill AO announced the 30-man squad at the annual John Eales Medal Dinner in Brisbane.

The squad will complete three training camps in Australia, the first of which will be held in Manly from Tuesday 31 July, prior to their departure for the World Cup on August 23.

The squad will then embark on a week-long pre-tournament camp in Portugal and a promotional visit to Paris before arriving at their World Cup training base in Montpellier on August 31.

The Wallabies have been drawn in Pool B of the tournament and will play their opening pool match against Japan in Lyon on 8 September before matches against Wales (in Cardiff), Fiji (in Montpellier) and Canada (in Bordeaux).

The Wallabies squad includes seven Queenslanders and a total of fourteen players with previous World Cup. Brothers' players Sean Hardman and Sam Cordingley were two of the Reds picked with Sam battling back from a foot injury that forced the 31-year-old missed the entire season.



Fiji:

The new coach and former Brothers' player, Ilivasi Tabua, is enthusiastic about the game and has struck a confident tone ahead of the tournament.

"I was thrilled to be offered the job because I played for Fiji at the 1999 Rugby World Cup, but now I will actually get to put the team together and take them to France in September," Tabua said.

"When I took up the coach's offer, I already had a fair idea of what the best team is and who will be in it."

"Fijians are gifted rugby players with a free-flowing style. At the moment, there are many gifted rugby players out there who could see Fiji do well in France."

Australia should have little trouble in sealing top spot, meaning one quarter-final place is up for grabs.

The team has the ability to beat Japan and Canada, which is likely to set up a winner-takes-all clash with Wales, the other big fish in Pool B.

Tournaments are not easy to predict and, while there is some margin for error among the top teams, Fiji has to maximise every opportunity if it is to reach that elusive spot in the last eight.

A part of rugby folklore

JIM KENNY

Rugby union coach
Born: Brisbane,
June 17, 1936
Died: Caloundra,
June 26, 2007

It was the springboard to four seasons in charge of the state team. It was a pivotal period (1972-75) with the holy trinity of Queensland rugby, Paul McGee, Tony Shaw and Mark Loane, being ushered in.

The rolled-up match program was always in his fist and the look of blood pressure rising was always in those much-loved facial contortions.

After forwards Dwyer and Mick Freney raised his tie with a night on the town before the game against NSW in Sydney in 1974, he threatened to send them home.

Instead, he ran the hangovers off for three torturous hours at training the next day for the desired effect. Then dominant NSW was humbled 20-7.

Outside of his devotion to family, Brothers was the biggest influence on his life.

His match-day build-ups in his early Brothers years were legendary.

"We'd have a steak lunch, Potatoes dripping in butter were the carb overload,"

former Wallaby prop Chris Hardy recalled of game-day patherings at Kenny's Ararat Hills home.

"We'd get a haircut from our masseur Vern Honan, who would also be let loose on us to

He could relieve the 10 tries from the memorable 35-9 thumping of premiers University in the 1965 club grand final right down to sideline discussions and selection twists. Players played for him.

While he had great regard for hawks such as David L'Estrange, Jeff McLean, Mick Barry, Barry Honan and Alex Pope at

Brothers, his dressing room addresses revved up his physical forwards most of all.

"We used to call the backs the ladies. They'd do their stuff after it was won up front where I loved to work," Kenny said.

"They were great days at Brothers. There was a bonding and spirit there. Players were terribly loyal to me and one another."

It was former Wallaby backrower Dallas O'Neill, his 1966 premiership captain, who was still by his side nearly 40 years later to help him through his first radium treatment for cancer.

"Jim was a hands-on coach and his enthusiasm was just brilliant. Like Mal Meninga with the current State of Origin team, he got hokies bonded together," O'Neill said.

Former Wallaby forward Mick Purcell recalled one classic Kenny occasion at Brothers training in the 60s.

"Jimmy was a great coach and motivator. One night Jimmy started everyone up yelling. Come on... buckle up."

"Well, we kicked off to him

and I took him at his word," Purcell recounted.

"I was a pretty good tackler and poor old Jim ended up in the fetal position and that's the position he was still in when we carried him off the field. I thought I'd killed him."

Mr Kenny raised himself as a "very ordinary" lower grade fullback. He was presented with a how-to-coach rugby manual after his earliest foray into the art, yet it was the advice he flourished in.

He was a plumber by trade, who worked in building supplies. He put those skills into the fit-out of new club facilities in the 1960s, forever giving his club a helping hand.

He became a brewery rep for Castlemaines-Perkins later in life.

He is survived by his wife Joyce, children Anne, Moira and Robyn and grandchildren Michael, Nicholas, Patrick, Creta and Darcy.

A requiem mass will be held tomorrow at St Blamien's Church, 194 Hamilton Rd, Zillmere at 11am.

'Smallest' Wallaby part of Bledisloe history

JOHN FOGARTY

Advertising representative,

rugby player

Born: Warwick, October 18, 1928

Died: Sydney, July 3, 2007

JOHN Raymond Fogarty may have played for the Wallabies but, to those who knew him best, he was simply a "real character" who always had a smile.

He came from a local lineage — his grandfather John Fogarty was mayor of Toowoomba from 1887 to 1893, and his father worked for Queensland Railways.

One of two children, he spent his childhood in Allora where he was enrolled at St Joseph's Convent School in 1934, even as a young boy his lively character and sense of humour were evident.

He attended Christian Brothers College, Nudgee, where he completed his schooling in 1946 as a prefect. During his school years, he developed a keen interest in sports.

Longtime friend, former MP Tom McVeigh, remembers when Mr Fogarty came third in a 100 yard sprint at a school competition despite competing with a torn hamstring, an

effort he said was indicative of his character.

It was also while at school that he began playing rugby union, a game in which he would prove to have considerable talent.

When home from Nudgee on holidays, he would play for the Allora senior team, despite still being school age. At school, he played in the Nudgee First XV for three years, captaining the combined GPS team against Queensland University Firsts in 1946.

After school, he also spent time as an apprentice pharmacist with Delamutys Chemist in Brisbane. However, he did not pursue the profession in the long term.

Continuing with his rugby after school, he played for Brothers Rugby Club in Brisbane and went on to represent Queensland from 1947 to 1949. It was selected to play on the wing for the Wallabies in two Test matches against New Zealand.

He also toured New Zealand as part of the Wallabies team captained by Trevor Allan — it was the first team to bring the Elected Cup back to Australia.



Despite being regarded as one of the smallest players in Wallaby history, Mr Fogarty was well known for his speed, determination and ability to bring down players much bigger than himself.

He was also offered an invitation to play professional rugby league, which he did in north Queensland's Paley Shield competition and New Guinea.

In New Guinea he met Betty McDonald, a teacher. They later married and had a son, Charles, born in 1959.

On their return to Australia, the family lived for a time in Brisbane, before settling in Sydney, where Mr Fogarty worked in advertising in the newspaper industry.

When he retired at 65, he remained in Sydney, where he enjoyed simple pleasures such as helping out his disabled neighbour by walking his dog, and having a flutter on the horses.

He had an affinity with humans and animals and, according to Mr McVeigh, even the most ferocious dog sensed a friend in him.

Those closest to him describe him

as a "true blue Aussie" who was not interested in glitz or glamour, and who could always make his friends laugh.

Mr McVeigh said his friend was the kind of person who simply enjoyed helping people.

"He had a wonderful ability to make people feel important," he said. "He was a real Australian who enriched other people's lives and who didn't take himself too seriously."

Despite his many talents, Mr Fogarty remained a modest man.

He once declined a dinner invitation where he was to be publicly presented with his Wallaby cap, preferring to have it given to him privately by Mr McVeigh.

In 2006, he was honoured by the Nudgee Old Boys with an invitation to be the first signature on a jersey to be signed by all Nudgee Old Boys Rugby Internationals for a fundraising event.

He is survived by Betty, son Charles and four grandchildren.

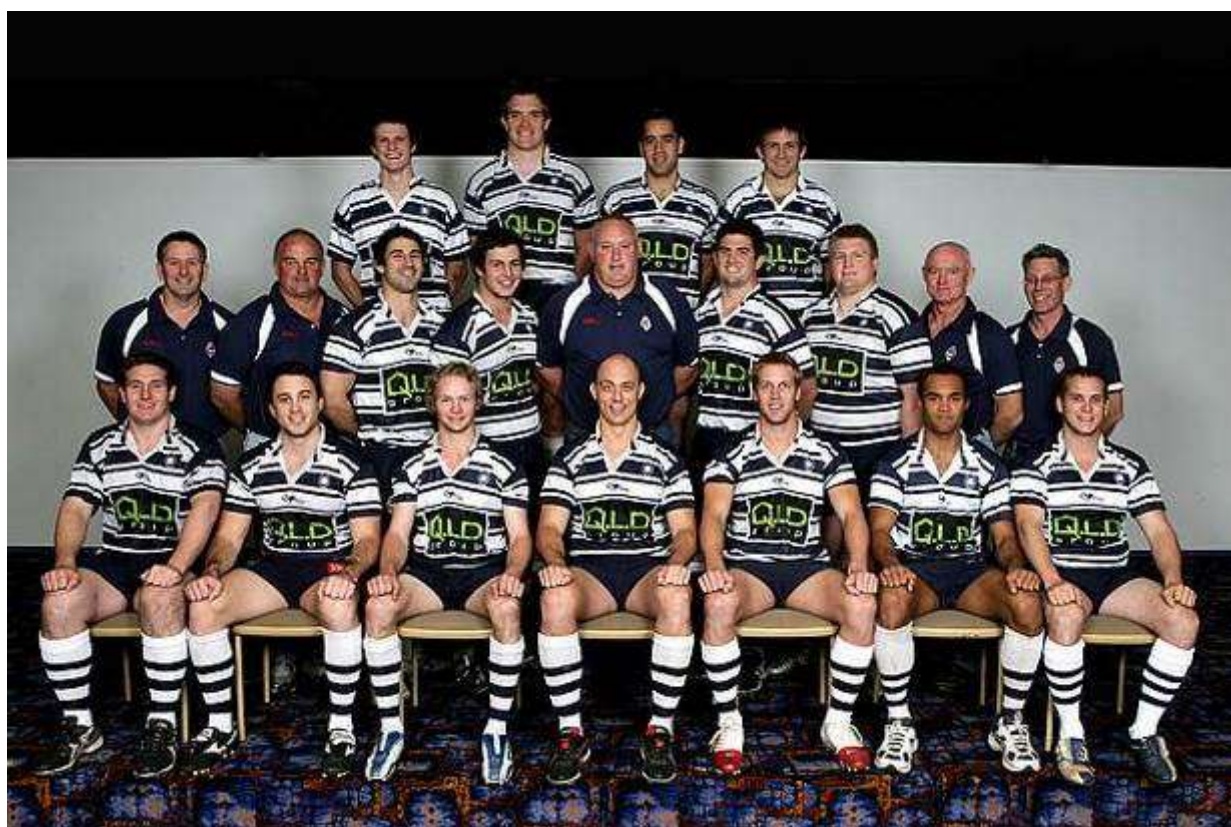
